DR. ERIC J. WILLIAMS is the Chair of the Department of Criminology and Criminal Justice Studies at Sonoma State University. He teaches courses on constitutional law, the Supreme Court, and punishment and corrections. He teaches on critical thinking, and lectures on various topics relating to prisons and prison management, for associations and agencies across the country.
