The CVI and the Department of Victim Studies at Sam Houston State University will host its first virtual webinar in April! The webinar will highlight various victimizations including Child Sex Trafficking, Native American, and LGBTQ+ victimization. We will have speakers from the Texas Governor's Office—Child Sex Trafficking Team, StrongHearts Native Helpline, and Equality Texas to speak about their organization and the members of the community that they serve. To briefly introduce the agencies, the Texas Governor's Office—Child Sex Trafficking Team is designed to "protect children from sexual exploitation, help the public recognize signs of sexual exploitation, help victims recover, support healing, and bring justice to those who exploit children." StrongHearts Native Helpline provides a 24/7 helpline for American Indians and Alaska Natives that experience domestic, dating, and sexual violence. Equality Texas works to equalize the rights of members of the LGBTQ+ community through "political action, education, community organizing, and collaboration". Each of these agencies implements practices that are culturally sensitive and centered on the community that they serve. We are excited to raise more awareness for these types of victimizations. 

Sexual Assault Awareness Month Events with the Department of Victim Studies

In recognition of Sexual Assault Awareness Month, the Department of Victim Studies at Sam Houston State University, under the direction of Dr. Shelly Clevenger, and the CVI will host community engaging events to assist survivors. It is our hope that these events raise awareness for sexual assault victimization and the diversity in survivors. First, on April 7, 2021, in the College of Criminal Justice at Sam Houston State University, we will host a Survivor and Ally Art Event in which attendees can paint and create art to support survivors. The artwork can be kept by the artist or donated to be sold for charity. This event will benefit SAAFE House and Montgomery County Women's Center. Moreover, the Department of Victim Studies and the Crime Victim Services Alliance (a student organization at Sam Houston State University "will host a panel to discuss male victimization and assault in partnership with the Huntsville SAAFE House". The panel will take place on Wednesday, April 21, 2021 from 2:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. in the Courtroom in the College of Criminal Justice at Sam Houston State University. Lastly, on April 28, 2021, the CVI, in partnership with the Crime Victim Services Alliance, the Department of Victim Studies, SAAFE House, and Montgomery County Women's Center will host a "Denim Day exhibit and resource fair to educate and raise awareness about sexual assault".
