Violence in Schools Webinar

On March 29, 2023, the Crime Victims' Institute hosted a free webinar to discuss violence in schools. Lynn Blakeslee, an Associate Principal for Cypress-Fairbanks ISD spoke on violence prevention in schools and detailed school safety prevention strategies, crisis procedures, and student safety. Angela Luna, Comprehensive Victim Intervention Specialist for Nueces County Juvenile Justice Center, discussed teen dating violence highlighting causes and prevention of this type of school victimization. Dr. Cathy Marcum, Chair and Professor of Criminal Justice, Department of Government and Justice Studies at Appalachian State University, spoke on research concerning bullying victimization and covered the causes and impacts of bullying victimization on students. Our speakers were wellversed and knowledgeable in their areas of study and practice. The webinar was attended by students, professors, victim service professionals, and educators. On April 26, 2023 from 12:30-3:30 pm, there will be a Victim Studies Volunteer Day at the Hospitality House.
