Summer Research Projects

The Crime Victims' Institute (CVI) is excited to collaborate with a team of scholars to conduct research in various areas of victimization. All of the scholars come from various institutions, such as Sam Houston State University, Sacramento State University, and Cleveland State University.

Dr. Breanna Boppre, an Assistant Professor in the Department of Victim Studies at SHSU, will examine the COVID-19 pandemic and its impacts on families with incarcerated loved ones. She will also explore student survivors of crime.

Dr. Danielle Slakoff, an Assistant Professor of Criminal Justice at Sacramento State University, will examine media representation of victimization.

Dr. Miltonette Craig, an Assistant Professor in the Department of Criminal Justice and Criminology at SHSU, will examine defenseinitiated victim outreach.

Dr. Mike Vaughn, Professor in the Department of Criminal Justice and Criminology at SHSU, and Ph.D. student Anne Wingert will examine mandated reporting and legality with respect to child maltreatment.

Dr. Eric Connolly, an Associate Professor in the Department of Criminal Justice and Criminology at SHSU, will explore violent victimization from adolescence to adulthood.

Dr. Meghan Novisky, an Associate Professor in the Department of Criminology Anthropology and Sociology at Cleveland State University, will examine prison violence and victimization.

New CVI Advisory Council Appointments

On April 5, 2023, Governor Greg Abbott appointed new members to the CVI Advisory Council [1], including David Schwartz, a retired pharmacist and member of the Houston Area Pharmaceutical Association, Houston Promotional Products Association, Harris County District Attorney's Office Victim Advisory Panel, and Parents of Murdered Children, Inc.
