In July, CVI team members Dr. Miltonette Craig and Mayra Peña attended the 4th Annual Female Survivors of Violence Conference as exhibitors in Plano, Texas. The conference invites professionals and individuals alike to engage in meaningful discussions about trauma and recovery. Last month, Dr. Craig, Mayra, and Cristal Hernandez attended the 2025 Gulf Coast Campus Safety Summit in Houston, TX. The event, sponsored by Jana's Campaign, is a one-day conference on preventing and responding to relationship violence, sexual assault, and stalking on college campuses. The CVI served as an exhibitor, but Dr. Craig was also invited to be a speaker and led a breakout session on Recognizing and Dispelling Myths about Image-Based Sexual Abuse.

Additionally, Dr. Craig and Cristal were invited to attend and observe the <u>Texas Association Against Sexual Assault (TAASA)</u> Law Enforcement Sexual Assault Training (LESAT) in South Padre Island, TX. Attendees, which included 140 Law Enforcement from across Texas, learned about trauma-informed approaches to investigation and victim support strategies through multiple sessions.




